Whole School Review

Between Tuesday 18th and Thursday 20th June, our school will undergo a Whole School Review where we will receive a visit from an experienced member of the school review team and a school principal to engage with our community and stakeholders to review our progress in regards to our strategic plan using the *School Improvement Tool*. The reviewers will examine our school's policies, procedures, performance and partnerships through the lens of the nine domains that form the *School Improvement Tool*:

The review team will complete a scan of the school against these nine domains and have conversations with students, staff, our P&C executive, families, cluster school staff and regionally based departmental staff. From these conversations and a review of our processes and documentation, they will prepare a report which will highlight our strengths and outline potential for improvement that will help guide our next strategic plan to come into effect from 2025 through until 2028. The review will prove a valuable opportunity to reflect on our progress and celebrate our successes over the last four years.
